Abstract Submittal Abstracts are now being accepted. The deadline for abstracts is **March 1, 2009, 6:00 pm (MST)**.

To submit an abstract, please email a Word document or rtf formatted text document to:

To submit an abstract to the conference, please follow these guidelines:

1. Submit name and e-mail of corresponding author.
2. Determine which session it fits into; 1.) Paleontological research on public lands, 2.) Permitting and museum collections, 3.) Partnerships in management and research, 4.) Law enforcement and fossil protection, 5.) Education stewardship and public involvement, or 6.) International perspectives and clearly state this in the second line of the document.
3. Select your preferred mode of presentation: **Oral, Poster, or Either** (no preference) and indicate your choice at the end of your abstract document. (**Please Note:** *The program organizers will do their best to fit you into your preferred mode. However, they will override your original mode selection if they feel your paper would fit well in a particular session with other compatible abstracts. The decision of the program organizers is final.*)
4. Compose your abstract in Microsoft Word format or as an .rtf format text document. Each abstract must contain the following:
 - **Title** - the title should be all capital letters in bold Times New Roman 12 pt font
 - **Keywords** - select up to five keywords for index searches
 - **The names and contact information for all of the authors** (last names first, all capital letters). All text in this portion must be in Times New Roman 12 pt font. **No more than 10 authors may be listed on a paper. Group names will not be accepted as an author.**
 - **The body of your abstract** - The body must be in Times New Roman 12 pt font. The abstract body should be longer than two or three pages.
 - **Simple line drawings may be inserted in body of abstract.**
5. Before sending your abstract, please do the following:
 - Check the spelling of the abstract's body and title using your own word processor.
 - Read it again and make sure that it is something the whole world should see. (We will not rewrite these for you.)
6. You are ready to submit when you have available all of the information listed above. Please attach the Word or rtf document to an email and address it to:

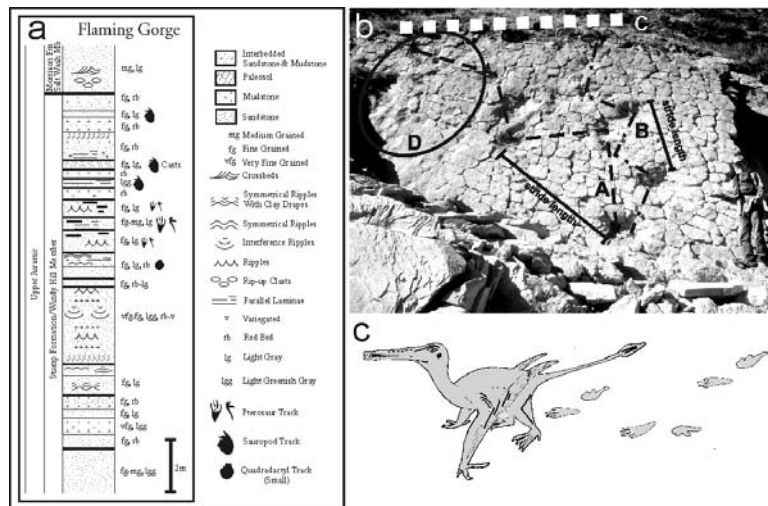

VERTEBRATE ICHNOFOSSILS FROM THE UPPER JURASSIC STUMP TO MORRISON FORMATIONAL TRANSITION—FLAMING GORGE RESERVOIR, UTAH

Morrison Formation, Jurassic, pterosaur tracks, dinosaur tracks, Flaming Gorge

The United States Bureau of Reclamation commissioned the Utah Geological Survey to organize a preliminary survey for paleontological resources along the shoreline of Flaming Gorge Reservoir in northeastern Utah in the spring of 2002. During that work, the authors discovered sauropod trackways on a vertical sandstone cliff of the uppermost Stump Formation (b). Closer investigation of the strata revealed not only the undertracks of a small adult sauropod but a trackway representing a juvenile sauropod as well. In addition, there are well-preserved casts of sauropod manus and pes prints weathering from an overlying dinoturbated horizon (a). Approximately 4 m below the sauropod tracks, there are a series of thin bedded, ripple-marked sandstone units with several pterosaur trackways preserved (c) as well as a small quadrupedal trackway. These tracks are preserved in marginal marine deposits along the retreating shoreline of the Sundance Seaway that interfinger with the fluvial and overbank units of Salt Wash Member of the Morrison Formation in northeastern Utah. The typical fluvial cross-bedded sandstone units of the Salt Wash Member are well exposed a couple of meters above the sauropod trackway.
